



## Learning Resource Program

### The following accommodations can be supported at Fenwick High School:

- Extended time for tests, quizzes, and semester exams (up to time-and-a-half); and
- Preferential seating.

### The following accommodations cannot be supported at Fenwick High School:

- Modified curriculum;
- Modified assessments and assignments;
- One-on-one instruction;
- Alternate test setting; and
- Small group testing.

All requests for accommodations will be considered after Fenwick has received and reviewed the following:

- A student's current (within three years) and complete psycho-educational evaluation.
- Formal IEP/504/Official Accommodations Plan from previous school, if applicable.

After the above documents have been submitted to Fenwick, each of the student's teachers will provide feedback regarding the academic progress of the student in each class. Fenwick will carefully review teacher feedback and all submitted documentation to determine whether a student is eligible for an Academic Achievement plan; the presence of a learning disability does not automatically require Fenwick to provide accommodations.

If a student is eligible for accommodations, Fenwick will formalize an Academic Achievement Plan outlining the approved accommodations. This plan will be shared with a student's classroom teachers and counselor. The Academic Achievement Plan will be reviewed on a yearly basis.

If requested by the family, the Academic Achievement Plan will be used when requesting standardized testing accommodations while the student is at Fenwick High School

Please note the following:

- After all documentation, including teacher feedback, has been received, the review and determination process will take up to 30 school days.
- Our eligibility process will not be expedited in order to accommodate students ahead of final exams or ACT/SAT testing.
- In order for Fenwick to apply for accommodations on the ACT, SAT, PSAT, and/or AP Exams, the student must have had an academic achievement plan in place for one full semester prior to the request.
